
Scott River Recovery Action Plan Project (SRRAPP)



"The Scott River Watershed Council (SRWC) has developed this plan for the Scott River watershed for the purpose of cooperatively establishing a common strategy for restoration and management actions."

23 Sections, including watershed history, land use, limiting factors for salmonids, and water quality, however, the following were identified as important but not fully addressed:
